

Troubles continue, aid also continues

This statement describes the situation in Yemen. Humanitarian conditions continue to deteriorate. Because, according to the evaluations of the United Nations, 80% of Yemenis are in need of humanitarian aid. On the other hand, public services are almost at a standstill after more than eight years of continuous conflict.

This requires greater engagement and consolidation of efforts by humanitarian action partners at national, regional and international levels.

Realizing this, CRB has implemented two different emergency and sustainable development programs in 2022. These programs have covered many urgent, seasonal and sustainable

projects aiming to contribute to support the capacities of local governments to alleviate the suffering of poor and displaced families and to fill the gap in the provision of public services to the public. In 2022, CRB contributed to solving the problems of 611,296 beneficiaries in 13 different provinces of Yemen.

Sustainable development programs

CRB has realized a total of 18 projects in three different provinces and reached 37,154 beneficiaries in four different development areas in order to contribute to the achievement of its goals of sustainable development and raising the ability of the society to have the opportunity to live a dignified life.

Sustainable development programs:

Coalition of Relief and Building (CRB) contributes to the realization of projects towards sustainable development goals.

Ending poverty and hunger

CRB has made the following contributions;

- As a result of feeling their own strength and security by providing them with sustainable shelter, 72 poor families were supported to consider their own living possibilities.
- By creating small projects, six poor families were supported to obtain a source of income.
- 30 people with special needs were given computer skills.

Health and well-being

CRB has made the following contributions;

- Access to emergency health services has been improved for 3600 individuals (diet and vaccination)
- The number of two authorized medical staff in Es Sitt camp in Marib was increased.

Quality Education

CRB has made the following contributions;

- Contribution was made to the participation of 540 students under the age of seven in the newly opened classes..
- •1340 boys and girls were saved from dropping out of school .
- Education capacity has been increased, including 3 schools and 26 classrooms in total.

Clean water

26686 Beneficiaries

CRB has made the following contributions;

- Access to sustainable use of clean water has been facilitated for 350 families in Marib province.
- Cleaning behaviors were supported to reduce the spread of epidemic diseases.
- 10 eligible families were provided with sewerage service.
- As a result of not using diesel and being content with solar panels, the rate of carbon emissions has been reduced.

Providing sustainable shelter to the most vulnerable:

The transition of the family lifestyle from weak tents that do not meet the needs of life to houses that provide privacy and security gives the family a sense of dignity and equality with other members of the society, so that they feel the family power, tend to think, work to develop their capacity and look for opportunities to improve their livelihoods in a way that contributes to their

self-sufficiency. While they live in the tent, they feel weakness and direct their thoughts to providing the minimum daily needs in order to survive. For this reason, they mostly exhibit negative behaviors. CRB provided permanent housing to ten families with special needs and temporary housing to 64 unemployed families in Marib province.

Economic possibilities:

Small economic projects are considered a strong basis for supporting infrastructure and supporting the economic and commercial opportunities of families and individuals. This is even more important in local communities, which are in need of large-scale or medium-scale development projects and programs.

Most of the members of these societies generally take shelter in certain structures. When they see those who support the implementation of such projects with their simple initiatives and who support them in development, they develop their feelings of self-sufficiency and this enables them to get rid of the collapse and return

to production. In 2022, CRB improved the opportunities of five families from the weaker segment by providing education and small commercial projects, thus writing a success story in helping families recover and earn a steady income.

Building alternative schools:

CRB has implemented a series of sustainable education projects that contribute to the compensation of the education process by constructing 26 alternative classrooms in three different schools in the camps that will be used by a total of 1560 students.









Years pass and events are flowing fast. Living conditions in Yemen still continue to worsen. The real disaster is that the next generation will grow up in ignorance as a result of the destruction of the education system. So much so that the reports reveal that about fifty percent of the education system has been completely or partially damaged as a result of the events. Accordingly, in line with UNICEF state-

ments, approximately 2,000,000 male and female students had to leave education in Yemen. This means a great disaster for Yemen and the future of Yemenis.

In order to make up for the shortcomings of educational institutions and contribute to improving their capacities, CRB has implemented some sustainable education projects in 2022. These are as follows:







Clean water:

Water is life. The supply of water contributes to the stability of societies, economic and social development occurs, food is produced and people survive. Within the scope of the sixth of the United Nations Sustainable Development Program goals, 13 differ-

ent projects were implemented by the CRB on the supply of water suitable for use in 2022, and 26,686 individuals in four different provinces of Yemen benefited from these projects, which fall into the field of water safety and landscaping.

Construction of water pools and connection of water networks:

The storage of potable and usable water in safe and sustainable places (fixed tanks) is considered one of the most important factors of stability. CRB contributed to the sustainable storage of water by constructing water tanks (tower or ground) in four different provinces of Yemen.

Emergency aid programs

With the aim of easing the suffering of displaced persons and victims of natural disasters, CRB has implemented many emergency and seasonal aid projects in 2022, targeting the weakest families with various urgent special needs such as food, water, shelter, health, education and security and reached a total of 578189 beneficiaries in the province.

Total Beneficiaries of Emergency Relief Program in 2022



Food safety:

Various food safety projects carried out by CRB in 2022 resulted in the benefit of 552247 individuals in 13 provinces within the frame-Application area: Aden, Taiz, Capital Sana, Hadramut, Hajj, El Had-



Emergency food project:

Many emergency food projects were implemented by the CRB and 17,798 basic food aid packages were distributed in these projects, while 49,250 ready-to-eat food was distributed to weak families damaged by floods and rains.

These materials and food contributed to the support of families in need who were displaced from their homes and damaged by floods in some provinces in 2022.

food safety project (temporary):

In line with the food and agricultural security mass plan (FSAC) in Marib province, a food safety project was implemented in three different stages in order to cover the need gap, and 2958 migrant families benefited from these projects in 2022.




Water supply:

A number of water projects and reservoir distribution projects have been implemented by the CRB with the aim of preventing the use of contaminated water and contributing to the supply of drinking and humanitarian water to weak families, migrants and those affected by rain and floods. Approximately 1825 people benefited from these projects in the provinces of Aden, Taiz and Marip.












Shelter and non-food supplies:



Migration hides the dramatic human stories of thousands of families. Many immigrant families do not even have a shelter, and they continue their lives by laying a rug on the ground and watching the sky in the heat of the sun under the frost or in an empty space. CRB contributed to solving the problems of weak families by implementing some programs in the field of shelter and non-food items, and 8981 people in different regions of the Republic benefited from these programs in 2022.

CRB has managed to reach 2106 beneficiaries affected by emergency migration and natural disaster situations by distributing tents and tarps in coordination with humanitarian partners and authorities operating in the same field.

Non-food supplies project:

Many projects have been implemented by CRB in 2022. In this context, some shelter materials and essential household goods were distributed to weak families, IDP's, victims and weaker sections of the society staying in the camps. Thus, it contributed to the elimination of the problems of the immigrants and to the improvement of their living conditions.

In addition, clothes distribution projects were carried out for the children of weak and unemployed families during Ramadan and Sacrifice Feasts, and winter clothes, beds, blankets and air conditioners were distributed. A total of 6875 people benefited from these projects in Marib province.

With the aim of encouraging the children of IDP families to education, CRB has implemented educational projects (school bag and school uniform) form which a total of 175 individuals benefited.

CRB has a team (protection unit) specialized in the field of protection.

This unit provides many protection

programs and activities (general protection, children and GBV) in migrant camps in Marib province.

In 2022, 2285 people benefited from the protection area.
